# **2024 SIJHSAA BASEBALL ACTIVITY UPDATE**

#### **NFHS Rule Changes**

1-6-1 – Any wristband with defensive shifts/offensive plays/pitching choices or game directions attached shall be considered non-electronic equipment and is permitted as long as it is a single, solid color. For pitchers, it may not contain the colors white, gray or be distracting. It does not have to match the color of the uniform or the sleeves worn underneath the uniform. It shall only be worn on a player(s) wrist or forearm and pitchers shall wear it on the non-pitching arm.

1-6-2, 3-2-5 – One-way electronic communication devices are permissible from the dugout to the catcher while the team is on defense for the purpose of calling pitches. When using the electronic communication device, the coach cannot be outside the dugout/bench area.

#### Run Rules

15-run after 3 innings 12-run after 4 innings 10-run after 5 innings

## **Pitch Count Records**

Coaches are responsible to keep pitch count records on their pitchers during the regular season and state series games. Details on how to do this are listed on the Pitch Count Limitation Rules. Violations or failure to keep records will result in forfeiture of contests.

#### SIJHSAA Recommendations, but not required

- \*Time Limits: No inning should start after 2 hours
- \*International Tie-Breaker: May be instituted starting the top of the 8th inning.
- \*\*Time Limits and International Tie-Breaker will <u>not</u> be used in the SIJHSAA Baseball State Series.

## **Commonly Asked Questions**

Q1 – Can a baseball player on my junior high tam also play on a travel team at the same time? A – This is a local school decision. Coaches, students, and families need to check with the school administration regarding the school's policy on participation on a school team and a non-school team at the same time.

Q2 – Can a baseball player wear jewelry?

A – Yes – umpires still have the authority to rule on anything they deem dangerous.

Q3 – Do schools have to use a time limit or international tiebreaker on baseball games?

A – Competing schools may use either as long as both schools are in agreement pervious to the start of the contest.

## **Regional Officials Pay**

Regional Officials are each paid \$65 per game. The cost of which is split by the schools participating in the given contest (s).

## **Sportsmanship**

A <u>player</u> ejected from a contest must serve a 2-game suspension and complete the NFHS Sportsmanship Course. A payer ejected a second time during the school year must serve a 4-game suspension.

A <u>coach</u> ejected from a contest must serve a 2-game suspension and complete the NFHS Sportsmanship Course. A coach ejected a second time during the school year must serve a 4-game suspension.

A <u>fan</u> ejected from a contest must serve a 3-game suspension and complete the NFHS Sportsmanship Course. A fan ejected a second time during the school year will be banned from attending any further SIJHSAA Contests.

\*Note all player/coach/fan ejection consequences must be met, documented and confirmed by the SIJHSAA previous to eligibility and or attendance is reinstated.
